WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A SHOOTING IN SOUTHERN NORMAN. THEY LOCATED A VEHICLE WITH A BULLET HOLE IN THE REAR WINDSHIELD AND A TEENAGER INSIDE WITH A GUNSHOT WOUND. THE OFFICERS RENDERED AID UNTIL THE SUBJECT WAS TRANSPORTED TO THE HOSPITAL.
- · WHILE RESPONDING TO A BURGLARY IN PROGRESS. OFFICERS ENCOUNTERED AN ARMED SUBJECT WHO REFUSED TO SURRENDER. SWAT WAS ACTIVATED, AND THE SUBJECT BARRICADED HIMSELF FOR MORE THAN 12 HOURS. HE SHOT MORE THAN 75 BULLETS AT RESPONDERS. EVENTUALLY, THE SUBJECT SURRENDERED AND WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. NO OFFICERS DISCHARGED THEIR WEAPONS AND NO ONE WAS INJURED DURING THE INCIDENT.
- PATROL RESPONDED TO A REPORTED KIDNAPPING INVOLVING A 5 YEAR OLD CHILD. THE CHILD HAD BEEN ABDUCTED BY HER BIOLOGICAL PARENTS WHO DID NOT HAVE CUSTODY OF HER. AN AMBER ALTER WAS ISSUED, AND MEMBERS OF NPD AND OTHER METRO AGENCIES WORKED IN PARTNERSHIP TO LOCATE THE CHILD SEVERAL HOURS LATER IN OKLAHOMA CITY.
- OFFICERS WERE DISPATCHED TO A DISTURBANCE IN EAST NORMAN. THE SUSPECT, WHO HAD STABBED A VICTIM AND REPEATEDLY RAMMED THE VICTIM'S VEHICLE WITH THEIR OWN, FLED AS OFFICERS ARRIVED. THE SUSPECT LOST CONTROL OF THEIR VEHICLE SEVERAL MILES AWAY. AFTER BEING PLACED INTO CUSTODY, THE SUSPECT WAS ADMITTED INTO THE HOSPITAL DUE TO A POSSIBLE OVERDOSE.
