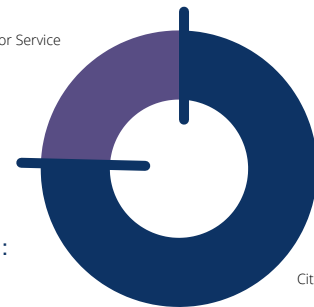

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORTED BURGLARY IN THE 700 BLOCK OF 60TH AVENUE NE. WHEN PATROL ARRIVED, THEY FOUND TWO MEN, ONE WEARING A FIREARM. THE SUSPECTS SAW POLICE AND FLED INTO THE WOODS. A PERIMETER WAS ESTABLISHED, A K9 AND DRONE WERE DEPLOYED. THE SUSPECTS WERE NOT FOUND. POLICE RECOVERED THEIR MOTORCYCLES FROM THE PROPERTY.
- PATROL WAS NOTIFIED OF A SINGLE-VEHICLE COLLISION ON WEST ROCK CREEK ROAD NEAR HAMDEN AVENUE. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THE VEHICLE WAS ENGULFED IN FLAMES. THE DRIVER, WHO WAS THE ONLY OCCUPANT IN THE VEHICLE, DIED AT THE SCENE.
- POLICE WERE NOTIFIED ABOUT A REPORTED DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE IN THE 2300 BLOCK OF ROGERS CIRCLE. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THE SUSPECT FLED IN A VEHICLE AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED. PATROL ATTEMPTED TO STOP THE CAR. THE SUSPECT REFUSED THE STOP FOR POLICE AND LATER CRASHED THE VEHICLE IN A PARKING LOT. OFFICERS ADMINISTERED NARCAN TO THE SUBJECT. HE WAS ARRESTED AND BOOKED IN TO THE CLEVELAND COUNTY DETENTION CENTER.
- PACE UNIT CONTACTED SUBJECTS LEAVING RESIDENCES SUSPECTED OF DRUG ACTIVITY. THE CONTACTS RESULTED IN THREE ARRESTS AND REMOVAL OF METHAMPHETAMINE AND FENTANYL.
