- POLICE RECEIVED A CALL ABOUT A SHOOTING IN THE 1200 BLOCK OF 12TH AVENUE SE. THE CALLER REPORTED THAT HE HAD SHOT A BURGLARY SUSPECT INSIDE A BUSINESS. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THEY FOUND A DECEASED MALE INSIDE THE BUILDING. DETECTIVES ARE INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT.
- THE NORMAN COMMUNICATIONS CENTER RECEIVED A CALL ABOUT A BURGLARY IN THE 200 BLOCK OF CHALMETTE DRIVE. THE CALLER ADVISED THAT FOUR PEOPLE BROKE INTO A RESIDENCE AND TOOK MONEY. THE GROUP OF PEOPLE WERE LAST SEEN LEAVING THE RESIDENCE. THE INCIDENT IS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS WERE NOTIFIED OF AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY AT A
 PHARMACY. A MALE ENTERED THE BUSINESS, BRANDISHED KNIFE
 AND DEMANDED A MEDICATION. EMPLOYEES TOLD THE SUSPECT
 THAT THE PRESCRIPTION WAS NOT IN STOCK. THE SUSPECT LEFT THE
 STORE. DETECTIVES ARE INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT.
- OFFICIALS BROKE GROUND ON THE EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS AND OPERATIONS CENTER (ECOC) AT 2801 E. ROBINSON STREET.
