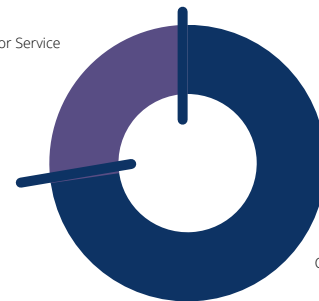

WEEK IN REVIEW

- SROS AND PATROL OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A DISTURBANCE NEAR ALCOTT MIDDLE SCHOOL ON MAY 15. A STAFF MEMBER ASKED AN INDIVIDUAL NOT ASSOCIATED WITH THE SCHOOL TO SLOW DOWN DUE TO ERRATIC DRIVING BEHAVIOR AROUND THE SCHOOL. THE DRIVER LEFT THE AREA, BUT RETURNED SHORTLY AFTER. UPON RETURN, THE INDIVIDUAL APPROACHED THE STAFF MEMBER AND DIRECTED THREATS TOWARD THE INDIVIDUAL AND THE SCHOOL AND THEN LEFT THE AREA. THE SUSPECT WAS IDENTIFIED. INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO SEVERAL REPORTS OF SHOTS BEING FIRED IN THE AREA OF HIGH MEADOWS AND 12TH AVE NE ON MAY 16. EVIDENCE OF A DRIVE-BY SHOOTING WAS LOCATED IN THE 1600 BLOCK OF WIND HILL ROAD. NO INJURIES WERE REPORTED BUT THE RESIDENCE SUSTAINED MINOR DAMAGE.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A TRAIN THAT HAD COLLIDED WITH A BICYCLIST AT THE E. BOYD STREET RAILROAD CROSSING ON MAY 17. OFFICERS LOCATED A DAMAGED BICYCLE BUT NO VICTIM. WITNESSES REPORTED THAT THE INDIVIDUAL RIDING THE BICYCLE WALKED AWAY FROM THE AREA FOLLOWING THE COLLISION. OFFICERS SEARCHED THE AREA AND CONTACTED LOCAL HOSPITALS, BUT WERE UNABLE TO LOCATE THE VICTIM.
- PATROL OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A ROBBERY THAT OCCURRED AT A MAIN ST. BUS STOP ON MAY 16. THE VICTIM STATED THAT AN UNHOUSED INDIVIDUAL GRABBED HIS BAG LEAVING BRUISES AND ABRASIONS ON THE VICTIM'S ARM. THE VICTIM'S BAG RIPPED, AND THE SUSPECT TOOK THE CONTENTS. THE VICTIM RECEIVED TREATMENT AT A LOCAL HOSPITAL FOR THE MINOR INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE INCIDENT.
- THE NPD FORENSICS LAB LAUNCHED THE FIRST GROUP TRAINING ON THE NEW FARO EQUIPMENT AND SOFTWARE. THIS TECHNOLOGY WILL ALLOW THE FORENSICS LAB TO SCAN AND RENDER 3-D VISUALIZATIONS OF CRIME SCENES AND CRITICAL INCIDENTS. THE IMAGERY WILL HELP BRING THESE EVENTS TO LIFE FOR COURTROOM TESTIMONY, PROVIDING A MORE IMMERSIVE AND COMPLETE UNDERSTANDING OF WHAT OCCURRED AT CRIME SCENES.
- AFTER MONTHS OF PREPARATION, NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE PARTNERED WITH THE NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION -- DOG IS MY COPILOT -- TO SEND 58 DOGS AND PUPPIES STRAIGHT INTO THE ARMS OF RESCUE PARTNERS IN COLORADO AND OREGON. THE FLIGHT TOOK PLACE ON MAY 16. THIS IS AN ONGOING PARTNERSHIP THAT WILL BENEFIT HUNDREDS OF ANIMALS IN OUR COMMUNITY.
- THE COMMUNITY OUTREACH SECTION TOOK PART IN VARIOUS EVENTS AS PART OF THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS SUMMER GAMES HELD MAY 15-17. SEVERAL OFFICERS ACROSS DIVISIONS TOOK PART IN THE ANNUAL LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN AND JOINED NUMEROUS NORMAN ATHLETES IN STILLWATER AS THEY PARTICIPATED IN THE GAMES.
