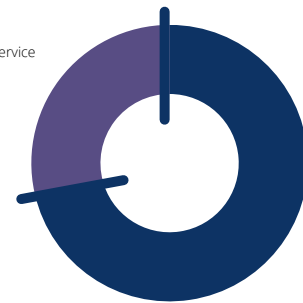

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A SINGLE VEHICLE INJURY COLLISION INVOLVING A MOTORCYCLE ON THE ON-RAMP TO LINDSEY ST FROM I-35 ON JULY 10. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THE MOTORCYCLIST LOST CONTROL AND STRUCK A CONCRETE BARRIER. THE MOTORCYCLIST WAS PRONOUNCED DECEASED AT THE SCENE DUE TO INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE CRASH. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE NPD/OU PD CIRT TEAM.
- PACE OFFICERS CONTACTED AN INDIVIDUAL DURING AN INVESTIGATION WHO HAD AN OUTSTANDING WARRANT. THE INDIVIDUAL ATTEMPTED TO RUN FROM THE OFFICERS, BUT WAS QUICKLY APPREHENDED WITHOUT INCIDENT. DURING THE ARREST, OFFICERS LOCATED A TRAFFICKING AMOUNT OF FENTANYL IN THE INDIVIDUAL'S POSSESSION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SUSPICIOUS ITEM IN THE 300 BLOCK OF HAYES STREET ON JULY 13. DUE TO THE NATURE OF THE ITEM FOUND, NPD'S HAZARDOUS DEVICES UNIT (HDU) WAS ACTIVATED TO INVESTIGATE THE DEVICE. UTILIZING THE UNIT'S SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT, THE DEVICE WAS CONFIRMED TO BE SUSPICIOUS AND POSSIBLY DANGEROUS IN NATURE. AFTER APPROXIMATELY TWO HOURS, THE NPD HDU RENDERED THE DEVICE SAFE AND REMOVED IT FROM THE AREA FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATION. AN ALL-CLEAR FOR THE AREA WAS ISSUED. THE INDIVIDUAL BELIEVED TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SUSPICIOUS DEVICE WAS ALSO LOCATED AND ARRESTED. THE INCIDENT REMAINS AN ACTIVE INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SHOOTING CALL AT A RESIDENCE IN THE 2200 BLOCK OF NASHVILLE DR ON JULY 14. UPON ARRIVAL, OFFICERS LOCATED ONE ADULT MALE AND ONE ADULT FEMALE WITH APPARENT GUNSHOT WOUNDS INSIDE THE RESIDENCE. THE ADULT FEMALE WAS PRONOUNCED DECEASED AT THE SCENE DUE TO INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE INCIDENT. THE ADULT MALE WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL WHERE HE LATER DIED AS A RESULT OF HIS INJURIES. NO SUSPECTS ARE OUTSTANDING. THIS INCIDENT REMAINS AN ACTIVE MURDER SUICIDE INVESTIGATION BY THE NPD CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION.
- SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS (SRO) KICKED OFF THE ANNUAL POLICE ACTIVITIES LEAGUE (PAL) CAMP ON JULY 10. THIS PROGRAM DEVELOPS LEADERSHIP SKILLS THROUGH THE STUDY OF TOPICS RELATING TO COMMUNITY SERVICE, DRUG PREVENTION, AND TEAM BUILDING. 30 STUDENTS ARE TAKING PART IN THIS YEAR'S CAMP.
