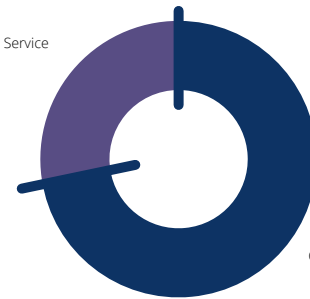

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REQUESTED WELFARE CHECK IN THE 11000 BLOCK E. STELLA RD. ON AUGUST 1. BOTH ELDERLY RESIDENTS, ONE OF WHICH SUFFERS FROM DEMENTIA, WERE UNEXPECTEDLY MISSING FROM THE RESIDENCE. OFFICERS SEARCHED AREA ON FOOT AND WITH A DRONE EVENTUALLY FINDING ONE RESIDENT DECEASED ON THE PROPERTY. THE OTHER RESIDENT WAS FOUND WALKING ALONG A ROADWAY A SHORT TIME LATER. ALTHOUGH THERE IS NO CLEAR SIGN OF FOUL PLAY, THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION INVOLVING 2 VEHICLES ON HWY 9 NEAR 108TH AVE SE ON AUGUST 4. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT ONE VEHICLE WAS TRAVELING EASTBOUND ON STATE HIGHWAY 9 WHEN IT WENT LEFT OF THE CENTERLINE AND COLLIDED HEAD-ON WITH A WESTBOUND VEHICLE. THE DRIVER OF THE EASTBOUND VEHICLE DIED AT THE SCENE DUE TO INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE COLLISION. THE DRIVER OF THE WESTBOUND VEHICLE ALSO DIED AT THE SCENE DUE TO INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE COLLISION. THE WESTBOUND VEHICLE ALSO HAD A CHILD PASSENGER WHO WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL AND REMAINS HOSPITALIZED. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE NPD/ROUPD COLLISION INVESTIGATION AND RECONSTRUCTION TEAM (CIRT).
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 30 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 11 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY OWNERS, AND 4 TRANSFERRED TO RESCUES THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, 54 ANIMALS CAME INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 205 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 75 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
