WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A STABBING AT A RESTUARANT IN THE 100 W. MAIN STREET AT 8:24PM ON 11/9. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED ONE VICTIM -- AN EMPLOYEE -- WITH NON-LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES. DUE TO DESCRIPTIONS AND INFORMATION PROVIDED BY WITNESSES, OFFICERS QUICKLY LOCATED THE SUSPECT A SHORT DISTANCE AWAY. THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED ON A COMPLAINT OF ASSAULT WITH A DANGEROUS WEAPON. THE INVESTIGATION REVEALED THE SUSPECT ENTERED THE RESTAURANT AND STRUCK AN EMPLOYEE IN THE BACK WITH A SHARP OBJECT BEFORE LEAVING. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SHOOTING IN THE 2000 BLOCK OF ALAMEDA ST ON 11/10. THE REPORTING PARTY TOLD COMMUNICATION OFFICERS THAT THE SUSPECT HAD FIRED A HANDGUN AT HIS EX-GIRLFRIEND AND THEN POINTED IT AT HER AS SHE STOOD WITH HER TWO CHILDREN. THE VICTIM WAS ABLE TO LEAVE IN A VEHICLE WITH THE CHILDREN BUT THE SUSPECT FOLLOWED HER, RAMMING HER VEHICLE. THE VICTIM GOT TO A SAFE PLACE AND OFFICERS LOCATED THE SUSPECT ARRESTING HIM FOR DUI, ASSAULT WITH A DANGEROUS WEAPON, DOMESTIC ABUSE, CHILD ENDANGERMENT, AND VARIOUS OTHER CHARGES. THE INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A COLLISION INVOLVING A TRAIN AND PEDESTRIAN JUST NORTH OF THE ACRES CROSSING AT 3:38AM ON 11/11. UPON ARRIVAL, OFFICERS LOCATED ONE ADULT FEMALE DECEASED JUST NORTH OF ACRES NEAR THE RAILROAD TRACKS. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 31 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 7 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. THEY ALSO TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 39 ANIMALS TO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 197 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 66 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
