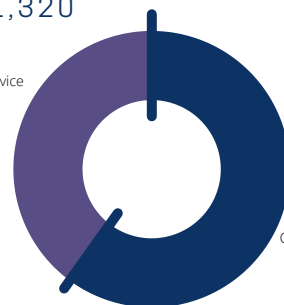

WEEK IN REVIEW

- COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED REPORTS OF A GUNSHOT IN THE 1900 BLK OF RENAISSANCE DR. ON 2/27. ONCE ON SCENE, THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION DETERMINED THAT A VERBAL ARGUMENT HAD ESCALATED TO A MALE SUBJECT SHOOTING A FIREARM AT THE OTHER HALF OF THE ARGUMENT. OFFICERS CONTACTED THE MALE SUBJECT WHO WAS ARRESTED WITHOUT INCIDENT ON A COMPLAINT OF ASSAULT WITH A DEADLY WEAPON.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION ON HWY 9 BETWEEN 48TH AVE SE AND 60TH AVE SE ON 3/1. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT A WESTBOUND VEHICLE CROSSED LEFT OF CENTER COLLIDING HEAD-ON WITH AN EASTBOUND VEHICLE. FOLLOWING THE INITIAL COLLISION, THREE ADDITIONAL VEHICLES WERE INVOLVED IN SUBSEQUENT COLLISIONS WITH THE INITIAL TWO VEHICLES. THE DRIVER, AND SOLE OCCUPANT, OF THE VEHICLE WHO CROSSED LEFT OF CENTER WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL WHERE THEY WERE LATER PRONOUNCED DECEASED DUE TO INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE COLLISION. FOUR OTHERS INVOLVED IN THE COLLISION WERE ALSO TRANSPORTED FOR MEDICAL CARE. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE COLLISION INVESTIGATION AND RECONSTRUCTION TEAM.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 28 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 5 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS, AND 1 ANIMAL TRANSFERRED OUT TO RESCUE THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 53 ANIMALS. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 121 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 18 OF THOSE ANIMALS IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
